Is Your Home Properly Addressed?

After you dial 911, minutes can feel like hours while you are waiting for the emergency responders to arrive. We do our very best to get to the scene of the emergency as quickly and as safely as possible.

If we can't find you quickly, critical help can be delayed.

Make sure your home can be easily found by emergency crews. Don't rely on sending someone out to the street to "flag down" help.

Here are some tips to make sure your home can be found easily in the event of an emergency.

- Use reflective numbers on a dark or colored background. A blue, red or green sign with white reflective numbers stands out best.
- Make sure you place an address sign at the end of your driveway AND place address numbers near your front entrance.



- Long shared driveways with multiple homes should have address signs at each branch in the road so we can follow the route to your home.
- Address rocks are nice, but they need to be large enough to be scene from the street even in dark, rainy conditions.
- Don't assume the responders know where you live!

Although technology is great and GPS maps are helpful, well placed home address signs are our best resource to find you quickly.

• Make sure vehicles are properly maintained. Check wipers, tires, fluids and keep some emergency supplies in your trunk just in case Check the weather strip and seals on your doors and windows to avoid losing heat and causing

- Dress in layers. It's better to be too warm and remove a layer than to be cold and have no choice
- If you have a wood stove, make sure your chimney is clean. Ensure ashes removed from the stove are placed in a metal container and cooled before discarding
